#### **History**

This year marks the 51st year of new play production at The Open Eye Theater. We were founded in New York City as Theater of the Open Eye in 1972, by the late famed dancer-choreographer Jean Erdman and her husband, the renowned mythologist Joseph Campbell. Renamed The Open Eye Theater, we relocated to the Catskill Mountains in 1994, where, under the leadership of producing artistic director Amie Brockway, we performed in eighteen villages and hamlets before creating a permanent home for theater in Margaretville NY, in 2006. 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### **Meet the Artists:**

AMIE BROCKWAY (Artistic Director and Project Director) is a proud recipient of the Sara Spencer Award of Artistic Achievement from the American Alliance for Theatre and Education, and was a nominee for the Orlin Corey Award for Artistic Excellence. Her directing credits at The Open Eye include "Thunder Mountain," "Fidelio," "Our Town," "Amber Waves," "Seneca Falls," "The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane," "One Night with Fanny Brice," "Irving Berlin's America," "Walking Toward America," "Romeo & Juliet," "The Tempest," "A Woman Called Truth," and numerous others. Her own radio play "The Road to Riverbank" was recently published by Leicester Bay Theatricals in Newport ME, and her plays "The Odvssey" and "The Nightingale" are published by Dramatic Publishing Company. She has performed in Open Eye productions "Summer Shortcuts XII," "Midsummer Madness," "Keeping Mr. Lincoln," "Ancestral Voices," "A Year Down Yonder," "A Christmas Carol," and most recently, "Dan Who??? She and her husband Ron live in Yulee FL and spend summers in the Catskills.

RON BROCKWAY (Set Design and EEYORE) was a member of the Ensemble and set designer for last season's "Thunder Mountain" at The Open Eye and played LESTER in "The Back Porch Gang" in "Summer Shortcuts XII." These were his first acting roles in many years. He has since reprised his design and Ensemble role in "Thunder Mountain" in a production at New Vision UCC in Yulee FL. Earlier this season, he performed in three short plays in "Dan Who???," a tribute to playwright Dan Berkowitz. Ron has worked in several theater groups in New Jersey, primarily as designer and as technical director. While in New Jersey, Ron worked front of house, as scenic carpenter, and as coordinator for McCarter Theater concert series on the Princeton University campus, and designed stage productions at the University's Theater Intime. He also spent ten years at New Jersey Public Television as head studio carpenter and in remote installations. In Florida. Ron's experience led him to the Vero Beach Museum of Art. His role as Director of Operations included designing and overseeing the installation of many types of art. It was for this that he was awarded the Laurel award of Excellence for Professionalism.

**BO ELFVING** (Managing Director of Foundation For The Open Eye, Inc.) is the co-founder of Road Safety Realities, a venture established to actively work towards reducing global road traffic crashes and fatalities. This venture developed as Bo co-authored the book "Reducing Global Road Traffic Tragedies: The Lost History of Success in the Rich World Now Urgently Needed in Developing Nations." Bo also provides CFO consulting services under the name HUB45, LLC. In his career, Bo has held CFO, COO and Controller positions, mostly in entrepreneurial settings, in software, technology, telecommunications, solar energy, advertising and bike share. He is a graduate of the Stern School of Business at New York University with a BS degree in Economics and Marketing, Cum Laude. Bo grew up in Stockholm, Sweden but for many decades now splits his time between New York City and Margaretville, NY.

**BRANDON HARGROVE** (OWL) was raised in Southern California, and transplanted to New York State in 2002. He participated in local theater starting with The Open Eye in 2004, helping do tasks for "Freddy, The King of Detectives" and acting in "Tartuffe". He played the role of DAN-NY in "Not for Sale" by Ev Ellsworth at the Roxbury Arts Group. Brandon also set up and helped with The Open Eye Theater's yearly Harvest Brunch and Auction. He moved to the Woodstock NY area in 2007 and acted in William Shakespeare's pays "As You Like It" and "Measure for Measure," hosted by Byrd-on-a-Cliff outdoor theater. He became a constant for The Performing Arts of Woodstock, doing stagehand/ setup and acting roles from 2011 until Covid 19 struck.

**ERWIN KARL** (Technical Director) has designed and operated lights and sound, designed and built sets, and served as technical director for many productions at The Open Eye, and for outdoor productions throughout the Catskills. He built the walkway extension from The Open Eye Theater building to the back parking lot. He has appeared on stage in numerous Open Eye productions. He is chair of the Board of Trustees of Foundation for The Open Eye. Other activities include co-hosting the Farm Hour and The Open Eye Theater's Playtime on WIOX Radio in the Catskills (91.3 FM) and serving as volunteer or trustee for a number of other non-profit organizations based in the Catskills.

**MILA KRANE** (CHRISTOPHER ROBIN) born in the east village of NYC, where she grew up (and still is growing up) surrounded by a rich performance community filled with artists, activists, and actors. Now twelve, going into seventh grade, she spends her summers, breaks, and most weekends soaking in the Catskills scenery. In fourth grade, she started out on the stage starring in a ten-minute play about climate change. Then in fifth grade, she tried her directing skills in the climactic scene of THE MERCHANT OF VENICE. She also participated in an ensemble in THE TOGON AND THE LIGER with a children's theatre. She then tried out her technical skills in sixth grade on the tech crew of her school's production of MATILDA. She also worked on her acting skills in weekly drama and improv classes. Mila is very excited to be in THE HUNDRED ACRE WOOD with The Open Eye Theater this summer.

**VIKTORIA KRANE** (RABBIT) is grateful to be part of "The Hundred Acre Wood's" cast. Since she was a little girl, she has found the stage to be a captivating and magical place, where stories come alive. **CAROL SCHWARTZ** (Assistant Stage Manager) has been an avid supporter of theatre for young audiences for over 50 years. She founded youth theaters in North Carolina and Georgia, and served in the education department of the Alliance Theatre in Atlanta for 32 years. With The Open Eye Theater, Carol has appeared in Sandy and Her Three Weird Sisters, Midsummer Madness and several play readings. She was a Stage Manger for The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane and for Amber Waves.
