History

This year marks the 51st year of new play production at The Open Eye Theater. We were founded in New York City as Theater of the Open Eye in 1972, by the late famed dancer-choreographer Jean Erdman and her husband, the renowned mythologist Joseph Campbell. Renamed The Open Eye Theater, we relocated to the Catskill Mountains in 1994, where, under the leadership of producing artistic director Amie Brockway, we performed in eighteen villages and hamlets before creating a permanent home for theater in Margaretville NY, in 2006. 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January 2022 - To Present

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Meet the Artists:

DAN BERKOWITZ was born in New Jersey. As a student at Princeton University, he acted, directed and produced seasons at the student-led Theatre Intime. He also became involved with McCarter Theater, a professional regional company (where he and Amie Brockway first met). While in Princeton, Dan traveled in theatrical and literary circles which included Peter (Jaws) Benchley, George Goodman, aka Adam Smith on PBS, Joyce Carol Oates, and other luminaries. Berkowitz subsequently moved to New York City, becoming Associate Producer of the David Suskind Show. Amie Brockway, who was Associate Artistic Director of Theater of The Open Eye at the time, invited him to join the Theater's Board of Trustees, where he became acquainted with Artistic Director Jean Erdman and her husband Joseph Campbell --the renowned mythologist-- co-founders of Theater of The Open Eye. In time, Berkowitz became Chairman of the Board. During his tenure, he produced, directed and served as Emcee for spectacular Cabaret Fundraisers and brought a play by Joyce Carol Oats to the theater. Berkowitz moved to L.A. in the 1990s, where he co-directed The Alliance of Los Angeles Playwrights, a support and service organization for playwrights, whose membership now spans the globe. He was a writer for television and film projects, as well as a playwright with productions in more than 40 U.S. states and Canada. In L.A. Berkowitz continued to be a resource for The Open Eye, contributing plays to the theater's "Summer Shortcuts" series, and encouraging ALAP members to submit their work. Since then, several ALAP plays have been produced in the "Summer Shortcuts" series. Berkowitz last visited Margaretville in summer 2016. serving as Emcee for the 100th Birthday Celebration of Jean Erdman. He passed away in Los Angeles on December 16, 2019.

AMIE BROCKWAY met Dan in Princeton NJ, when he was a student at the University, and she was assistant to Arthur Lithgow, artistic director of McCarter Theater. She is artistic director of The Open Eve Theater and proud recipient of the Sara Spencer Award of Artistic Achievement from the American Alliance for Theatre and Education and was a nominee for the Orlin Corey Award for Artistic Excellence in 2020. Her directing credits at The Open Eye include "Thunder Mountain," "Fidelio," "Our Town," "Amber Waves," "Seneca Falls," "The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane," "One Night with Fanny Brice," "Irving Berlin's America," "Walking Toward America," "Romeo & Juliet," "The Tempest," "A Woman Called Truth," and numerous others. Her own radio play "The Road to Riverbank" was recently published by Leicester Bay Theatricals in Newport ME, and her plays "The Odyssey" and "The Nightingale" are published by Dramatic Publishing Company. She has performed in Open Eye productions "Summer Shortcuts XII," "Midsummer Madness," "Keeping Mr. Lincoln," "Ancestral Voices," "A Year Down Yonder," "A Christmas Carol," and others. She and her husband Ron live in Yulee FL and spend summers in the Catskills.

Meet the Artists (continued)

RON BROCKWAY was a member of the Ensemble and set designer for last season's THUNDER MOUNTAIN at The Open Eye and played LESTER in THE BACK PORCH GANG in SUMMER SHORTCUTS XII. These were his first acting roles in many years. He since reprised his design and Ensemble role in THUNDER MOUNTAIN in a production at New Vision UCC in Yulee FL. Ron has worked in several theater groups in New Jersey, primarily as designer and as technical director. While in New Jersey. Ron worked front of house, as scenic carpenter, and as coordinator for McCarter Theater concert series on the Princeton University campus, and designed stage productions at the University's Theater Intime, where Dan was directing. He also spent ten years at New Jersey Public Television as head studio carpenter and in remote installations. In Florida, Ron's experience led him to the Vero Beach Museum of Art. His role as Director of Operations included designing and overseeing the installation of many types of art. It was for this that he was awarded the Laurel award of Excellence for Professionalism.

BO ELFVING (Managing Director of Foundation For The Open Eye, Inc.) is the co-founder of Road Safety Realities, a venture established to actively work towards reducing global road traffic crashes and fatalities. This venture developed as Bo co-authored the book "Reducing Global Road Traffic Tragedies: The Lost History of Success in the Rich World Now Urgently Needed in Developing Nations." Bo also provides CFO consulting services under the name HUB45, LLC. In his career, Bo has held CFO, COO and Controller positions, mostly in entrepreneurial settings, in software, technology, telecommunications, solar energy, advertising and bike share. He is a graduate of the Stern School of Business at New York University with a BS degree in Economics and Marketing, Cum Laude. Bo grew up in Stockholm, Sweden but for many decades now splits his time between New York City and Margaretville, NY.

MARGE HELENCHILD currently serves on the board of The Open Eye Theater. She has worked with The Open Eye for over ten years as an actor, director, assistant stage manager, costume design, choreographer and project director of SSXII. Being an active feminist in NYC propelled her into becoming a founding member of many organizations including: The Women's Interart Center, Soho 20 Feminist Gallery, Garden Variety Mime Theater, the Radical Lesbian Feminist Terrorist Comedy Group, and Shock of Gray Theater Collective, which brought their production of "Smoke And Mirrors" to The Roxbury Arts Group stage. Two of her favorite roles were Carol in Ann Epner's three act play "The Letter" and Lucretia Mott in the Open Eye's musical, Seneca Falls". In 2019 she created her debut cabaret show "I'm Not That Girl" performed in NYC clubs, which was nominated for a MAC award. In 2022 she became a fellow in the Eugene O'Neill Cabaret Conference at their Theater Center in Waterford CT. "One of my favorite plays of Dan's is "Lovely Little Life" which I directed for Summer Shortcuts and we are reading for this celebration."

SANDRA HOLTZMAN was born in Manhattan, and grew up there. She is Founder and President of Holtzman Communications, LLC. The firm is headquartered in Manhattan, and is virtual. The company has won several awards, most recently a Gold RX Club Award for a direct-to-consumer website. Prior to starting her own company, Sandra was an award-winning creative director and copywriter. It was during that time that she met and worked creatively with Dan, and they became lifelong friends. She is a member of the Board of Trustees of Foundation for The Open Eye, Inc.

ERWIN KARL (*Technical Director, Lighting, Sound*) has designed and operated lights and sound, designed and built sets, and served as technical director for many productions at The Open Eye, and for outdoor productions throughout the Catskills. He built the walkway extension from The Open Eye Theater building to the back parking lot. He has appeared on stage in numerous Open Eye productions. He is chair of the Board of Trustees of Foundation for The Open Eye. Other activities include co-hosting the Farm Hour and The Open Eye Theater's Playtime on WIOX Radio in the Catskills (91.3 FM), and serving as volunteer or trustee for a number of other non-profit organizations based in the Catskills.

LINDA KUNDELL, as a child, acted in television and briefly studied with the renown Russian actress, Maria Ouspenskaya. In college Linda began singing international folk music and cabaret, performing in the San Francisco Bay area, Hollywood, Beverly Hills, Los Angeles, and Israel. Following college, her attention turned to opera. She studied voice in Italy and New York, and performed leading roles with the Amato Opera, including Rosalinda in Die Fledermaus, Mimi and Musetta in La Boheme, and more. Linda has appeared in solo recital in Carnegie Recital Hall and other New York City venues. Based on her singing training, Linda began teaching public speaking, coaching people in many walks of life. She has also enjoyed a successful career as a public relations consultant, including serving as spokesperson on TV and radio. Linda is a member of The Open Eye Board, of Trustees, where she was privileged to have known Dan Berkowitz.

ELIZABETH SHERR is excited to direct Dan's works: My Little Brother, When Oprah Says Goodbye, and The Memory Box; plus read Bobbie Jo in Dan's Twinkie Defense, Rita in Places Please, Sara in Silver Linings and A Lovely Little Life. In 2022 she directed The Back Porch Gang and More Pasta; played Michelle in A Life Enriching Community; Georgette in Weaving a Tapestry. Summer of 2021 she acted in Wilder's Our Town; Elmire in Moliere's Tartuffe, Stephano in Shakespeare's Tempest, Twelfth Night, As You Like it; Asher's Death Valley: A Love Story, M'Lynn in Harling's Steele Magnolias, and Eddie in Gurney's Ancestral Voices; also various productions of Dicken's A Christmas Carol; Brigett in Hoke's Flowers in the Desert; acted in Fabisch's Motherhood Out Loud!; written and performed for MHS Cemetery Tours: directed educational partnerships; teaches at SUNY Delhi; Treasurer for WIOX Radio Station; and Trustee for The Open Eye Theater.
